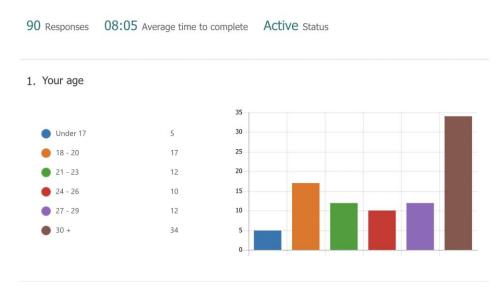
- Identify the main reasons young people choose to study tourism.

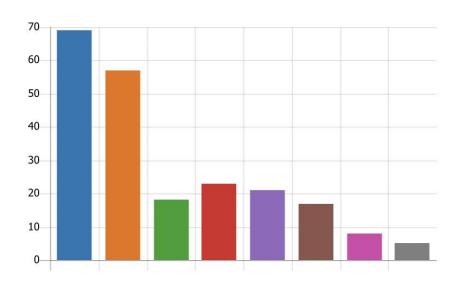
#### Survey - Young People's Choice and Interest in Tourism Studies



### 9. What factors would most influence your decision to study tourism? (select up to 3)

Interest in travel and cultures	69
Career opportunities	57
Internship options	18
Quality of education and lectu	23
Study costs	21
<ul><li>Location of studies</li></ul>	17
Influence of family/friends	8
Another factor	5

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## Key Findings factors influencing choices

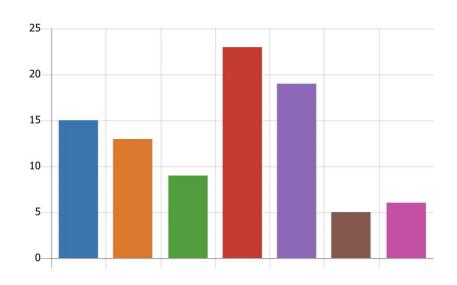
- Interest in travel and cultures is the top factor, chosen by the majority of respondents (69), indicating strong personal motivation.
- Career opportunities are also highly influential (57), reflecting practical considerations in students' decision-making.
- Other factors such as internship options (18), quality of education and lecturers (23), and study costs (21) are less influential but still noteworthy.
- Location of studies, influence of family/friends, and other factors play a minor role in comparison (all below 20).
- Personal interest and career prospects dominate decision-making in choosing to study tourism, while external influences and logistical concerns are less significant

### Challenges Faced

- Concerns about job stability and salary prospects.
- Perception that tourism jobs can be seasonal or demanding.
  - Need for more practical experiences during studies.

#### 16. What would be your main reason *not to choose* tourism studies?



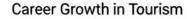


### Recommendations

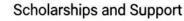
- Increase exposure to realworld tourism experiences (internships, field trips).
